How to Prepare for an Emergency

- Write down the GPS coordinates or the section, range and township of your property on the front of this form; post it near your telephone or in a location your family agrees upon.

This information is used by the ALERT helicopter team to locate your property.

Section, range and township can be found by referring to your title deed, or by locating your property on a Flathead National Forest map.

- Drive with your family to ALERT landing sites and sites with medical facilities. Discuss which are closest and which to use in case of an emergency.
- If your cabin/house doesn't have a phone...determine where the closest one is (i.e. neighbor, store etc.)

Prepare a **Family Disaster Plan**, which should include:

- What to do, who to call and where to take a victim in case of medical emergency.
- What to do, who to call and where to seek safety during a forest fire.
- A designated meeting place near your home that will be a safe distance from a forest fire or other hazard.
- A designated safe meeting place on the North Fork in case you can't return home.
- A designated out of area friend to check in with in case your family becomes separated.
- A good first aid kit.
- A good first aid manual.
