Learn about the trees on your property, their condition and what they need to thrive and regenerate.


UNDERSTORY and RANGE MANAGEMENT

On-site Consultation Following the Workshop - As Scheduled

After you complete your plan, a Certified Stewardship Advisor will visit you, at no additional cost, at your forest for about 2-6 hours. This is a great opportunity to consult with a resource professional about your objectives, your forest, and your Forest Stewardship Plan.



Workshop Registration Fee \$110 per Ownership Includes one set of course materials and a site visit to your property. Additional family members and/or partners representing the ownership are encouraged to attend at no additional cost. A duplicate set of workshop manuals are available at cost (\$110). Registration fees are not refundable after the application deadline but can be applied toward a future workshop.
