Be Bear Aware





- Do not leave feed and trash outside or in vehicles, trailers or tents
- Only use approved bear trash cans outside
- Don't let bears stay in yards or approach structures
- Clean and preferably store barbecues inside
- Install electrified fence around fruit trees, vegetable gardens and compost piles
- No bird feeders between April 1" to December 1"

Simple tasks keep the bears safe. Help us live safely with the wildlife!

We of the North Fork Patrol hope you return to the North Fork to find your place intact. If you find a problem with criminal mischief, theft or burglary, report it immediately to the Flathead County Sheriff's office at (406) 758-5585 and to North Fork Patrol Chairman Mark Heaphy (406) 890-5043 or m-mheaphy@hotmail.com.

In addition to checking on properties, the North Fork Patrol also pays a reward of up to \$500 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of any wrongdoers on the North Fork. The Patrol is <u>not</u> a law enforcement authority nor is it a full-time security provider; it is a neighborhood service of volunteers helping to keep an eye on their neighbor's properties as best as they can.
